HOSTING ORGANIZATION

TDM 2000 is an independent no profit organization, that coordinates young people willing to cooperate in the voluntary sector, supporting them in developing personal and professional skills through experiential learning and non-formal education. Main fields of interest: youth policy, entrepreneurship, human rights, democracy, intercultural learning, active citizenship, non-formal education, international cooperation, local development and migration. The group is composed by 800 members that actively participate in the projects of the NGO. AIM OF THE PROJECT

<u>"Youth Energies 2.0 - Creating a European Youth Participatory Agenda"</u> is a youth participation project that aims to support the youth participatory process, with the goal of providing them with opportunities to learn how to participate in civil society through pathways of learning, dialogue and sharing.



SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

To bring together young people and decision makers at different levels to foster dialogue at the European level and contribute to the development of ideas and recommendations:

To promote legal and normative recognition of the figure of the youth worker at the European level;

To support youth participation in the democratic life of the European Union;

To adopt innovative and new tools in the design and implementation of youth policies;

To support, through local activities, the development of digital skills and media literacy in order to improve conditions for access and participation in democratic life.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The project is designed both to help strengthen the capacities of the participants and to develop local practices of active participation in democratic and institutional debate.

The project includes a set of local and international activities.

LOCAL ACTIVITES will be presented during the international seminar and will discussed together.

INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES will be hosted in Cagliari, in November, for training and exchange of best practices. It is entitled "International

FINANCIAL PROCEDURE FOR TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT

ITALY - 6 pax - 23 € per person

BULGARIA - 4 pax - 275€ per person

POLAND - 4 pax - 275€ per person

SWEDEN - 4 pax - 275€ per person

LATVIA - 4 pax - 360 € per person

PORTUGAL - 4 pax - 275€ per person

SPAIN - 4 pax - 275€ per person

FRANCE - 4 pax - 275€ per person

LITHUANIA - 1 pax - 360 € per person



The nearest airport for travel is <u>Cagliari - Elmas</u>, about 6 km from the city of Cagliari. The Elmas Airport railway station is directly connected to the airport by a covered path served by a moving walkway. NOTICE

The travel reimbursement will be done by bank transfer only to the partner organization accounts for their group of participants or to one of the participants involve who will take responsibility, according to the rules by the National Agency.

The reimbursement will be done ONLY when the following steps are done:

- · Collect and provide the invoices; tickets (there must be a price, name of the person and mean of payment stated on it);
- · All boarding passes;
- · Mobility report filled by the participant.

TICKETS will be reimbursed considering only the official address of the sending organisation.

WHAT TO KNOW

In Cagliari there is a thing called "Imposta di soggiorno" which translated is like "Tourist Tax". It's 1,50€ per day, and unfortunately is not covered by the project! In November, temperatures in Sardinia range from 20 to 10 degrees, with a strong temperature range in the evening. We recommend that you bring appropriate clothes for different times of the day.

VENUE



Cagliari is an Italian municipality and the capital of the island of Sardinia, an autonomous region of Italy. Cagliari's Sardinian name Casteddu means castle. It has about 155,000 inhabitants, while its metropolitan city (including Cagliari and 16 other nearby municipalities) has more than 431,000 inhabitants. Cagliari is the 26th largest city in Italy and the largest city on the island of Sardinia.



Historical sites include the prehistoric Domus de Janas, very damaged by cave activity, a large Carthaginian necropolis, a Roman era amphitheatre, a Buzantine basilica. three Pisan-era strona towers and sustem of а fortification that made the town the core of Spanish Habsburg imperial power in the western Mediterranean Sea. Its natural resources have always been its sheltered harbour, the often powerfully fortified hill of Castel di Castro, the modern Casteddu, the salt from its lagoons.

The city of Cagliari is situated in the south of Sardinia, overlooking the centre of the eponymous gulf, also called Golfo degli Angeli ("Bay of Angels") after an ancient legend. The city is spread over and around the hill of the historic district of Castello and nine other limestone hills of the middle-to-late Miocene, unique heights of a little more than 100 metres (330 ft) above sea level on the long plains of Campidano.
